These activities for 8-9-year-olds are designed to engage older students with more complex and nuanced explorations of the themes, characters, and messages from "BFF Chicken." Through character analysis, book club discussions, interactive challenges, and creative writing contests, students can deepen their understanding of friendship, empathy, and social emotional skills in a mature and reflective manner.

1. Character Analysis and Role Play:
