

Activities for Six and Seven Year Old children inspired by “BFF Chicken”

These activities for 6 and 7 year-olds aim to provide engaging, interactive, and enriching experiences that build on the themes, characters, and messages from "BFF Chicken." Through creative expression, critical thinking, problem-solving challenges, and collaborative endeavors, children can deepen their understanding of friendship, kindness, and social emotional skills in a dynamic and age-appropriate learning environment.

Use included picture cards to help children review story and explore sequencing.

1 Friendship Comic Strip Creation:

- **Description:** Encourage children to create a comic strip or storyboard depicting a friendship-themed story featuring characters inspired by "BFF Chicken."
- **Objective:** Enhance storytelling skills, sequential thinking, and creativity while exploring friendship dynamics and positive social interactions.

2 Kindness Journal Reflections:

- **Description:** Provide students with personal journals to write or draw about acts of kindness they witnessed, experienced, or initiated each day, inspired by the book's themes.
- **Objective:** Promote reflection, gratitude, and emotional awareness through journaling, fostering empathy and mindfulness in daily interactions.

3 Friendship Theater Performance:

- **Description:** Organize a mini-theater production where students collaborate to create a play or skit based on the story of "BFF Chicken," performing key scenes showcasing friendship and kindness.

- **Objective:** Cultivate collaboration, public speaking, and creative expression while reinforcing positive values of friendship, empathy, and cooperation through dramatic arts.

4 Kindness Campaign Poster Project:

- **Description:** Challenge students to create kindness campaign posters promoting positive actions, inclusive behaviors, and friendship ideals inspired by the messages from "BFF Chicken."
- **Objective:** Encourage creativity, visual communication skills, and advocacy for kindness and empathy through the visual arts, empowering students to spread messages of positivity and compassion within their school community.
